



## Danger Level 1 - Low



Wind slab



1800m

Snowpack stability: **poor**Frequency: **few**Avalanche size: **small**

Newer, wind-blown snow (10 - 30 cm) is insufficiently bonded to older snow, with additional load it is possible to release an avalanche.

In the High, Western and Low Tatras at altitudes above 1800 m above sea level, there is still a SMALL avalanche danger, (1). Fresh snow has been blown by strong winds onto layers of older snow with which it is not sufficiently bound. The release of slab avalanches is possible especially under heavier loads on steep to very steep slopes. Spontaneous avalanches are not expected.

### Snowpack

During the last snowfall, 10-20 cm fell on the mountains, which was blown by strong winds to the leeward slopes. The blown snow is deposited in the form of less stable snow slabs and pillows, with older snow not sufficiently bound.
